November 2025 Cooloola Coast Realty Roundup General report on the Cooloola Coast property market

### **Property Market Update**

Over the past 12 months the housing market across Cooloola Coast has shown solid growth. In Cooloola Cove, for example, the median house sale price is around \$695,000, representing annual capital growth of about 12%. Houses in this area are also averaging around 62–63 days on market. Houses in Rainbow Beach have a median sale price of around \$940,000, with annual growth of about 8.7% in the past 12 months.

For units, the median sale price is around \$530,000 and growth for units has been stronger—over 10% in the past year (though this may reflect fewer sales and thus more volatility). This median takes into account more affordable units such as Rainbow Shores – typically around \$450,000 - \$470,000 for a 2 bedroom.

The median weekly rent for houses is about \$650, while gross rental yield for houses is approximately 4.3%.

For units, yield is similar, in the ballpark of 4–4.5%. The market drivers are: strong buyer interest (both owner-occupiers and investors), limited new supply of homes and land (especially relative to demand), and the lifestyle appeal of the region. An April 2025 report from yourinvestmentpropertymag.com.au noted heightened demand for affordable units and houses up to about the \$1.2 million mark in our region.

The old *Maheno's Restaurant* on the main street has been closed since May this year however, a new operator will be going in before Christmas, and we are all very excited to see what will be on offer in that space.
