DIY Tip - Filling Defects In Wood

- 1). Fill splits and dents in wood using all purpose Filler on painted surfaces and tinted wood filler on new or stripped wood.
- 2). Use the corner of a filling knife or a finger to work the filler into recesses. Smooth off the excess before it dries.
- 3). When the filler or wood stopper has hardened, use abrasive paper wrapped around a block to sand the repair down flush.
- 4). Paint or varnish the wood as required.
