## **DIY Tip - Laying & Maintaining A Gravel Path**

- 1). Excavate the area to a depth of 15cm and make the base firm.
- 2). Provide a firm edge to retain the gravel For straight paths, secure battens with pegs.
- 3). Compact a layer of hardcore. Add a mixture of sand and coarse gravel and tamp it firm.
- 4). Top off with fine gravel. Rake and roll repeatedly until the surface is firm.
- 5). Apply weed killer to a gravel pathway to keep weeds away.
- 6). Scatter new gravel on to the path to give it a fresh appearance.
