Numbers were reduced by 325 head, for a yarding of 755 cattle. Once again it was a pretty handy yarding. Sufficient numbers of prime local trade cattle. Very good numbers of yearling steers and heifers- suitable for both the processors and feedlot, and once again a fair percentage of the yarding was made up of cows. All regular buyers were in attendance and competing strongly in a fully firm to dearer market. Young trade cattle to the processors finished firm. The heifer portion were firm to 5 c/kg dearer. Feeder steers were 5-8 c/kg dearer, with the lead pens of Angus steers topping at 320.2 c/kg. Euro X steers made to 302.2 c/kg. Yearling heifers saw improved competition from both processors and feedlot orders. They improved 5-10 c/kg and both topped a little over 300 per kg. Lighter weight heifers made 210-260 c/kg. A little up on previous weeks sales. Heavy cattle were once again sought after. The steer portion sold to 323.2 c/kg and heifers topped at 299.2 c/kg.

Fully firm on last weeks sale. Buyers were once again active on cows. A couple of individual sales topped at 271.2 c/kg which was dearer by 10 c/kg, however the majority sold similar to last weeks rates. Bulls gained 20-35 c/kg. With an extra order pushing the price up. Weaners were fully firm.
