Numbers remained low for a yarding of 220 head slightly down from the last sale. There was only a handfull of prime milk vealers but an increased number of prime yearlings. The majority of the yarding consisted of yearlings mostly suitable for the feedlotters. About 50 cows penned. All regular buyers were in attendance and operating in a dearer market. Prime young cattle suitable for the butchers sold to solid competition to be up to 20 cents dearer. Young steers to feedlotters sold 30 cents dearer and more in places. The heavier weights gained 40 cents and more in places. Yearling heifers to processors were 20 cents dearer. Heavy cattle sold to solid demand & finished 10 to 15 cents better. Cows probably saw the best of any price rise. The best heavy cow reached a high of 390 cents thats 60 cents higher than the sale 2 weeks ago. The heavy D4 & D5 cows generally sold between the 330 to 380 cents. Bulls also gained 30 odd cents. The best bulls made a high of 315.5 cents.
