First sale back for 2023 saw agents yard 360 cattle. Quality was mixed & most of the yarding consisted of yearling steers & heavier export cattle. Most of the buyers were present & operated in a much cheaper market for feeder & restocker cattle, while the market was fairly firm for the heavier end. Not many true vealers yarded they topped at 450c/kg, most sales between 400c-440c/kg. Yearling steers to feed suffered the biggest loses compared to pre christmas sales, quality was a contributing factor & they sold consistently between 370c-390c. Heavy cattle sold to similar rates with better competition for the better finished ones. Heifers 500kg + sold from 330c-363.2c, while the heavy steers weighing 600kg topped at 376.2c most sales 355c-370c/kg. One pen of bullocks weighing 979kg made 323.2c coming back @ \$3164/hd. A good run of heavy 3 score cows topped at 330c & sold down to 310c/kg. Bulls topped at 276.2c/kg.
