After some much welcomed rain over the district, numbers reduced to 605 cattle. It was a fairly good quality yarding, particularly the heavy export types. All regular buyers were present, bar one, competing in a dearer market.

A few more vealers penned this sale, they sold 15-20 c/kg dearer, better quality overall helped.

Extra orders were operating in the feedlotter category. Medium weight Angus steers sold to a high of 427.2 c/kg, they gained all of the last few sales losses to be 40-50 cents dearer and more in places. Heavier weights saw 30 c/kg improvement.

There was a very good offering of prime yearling steers/heifers suitable for the processors. Both steers and heifers improved 20-25 c/kg for medium weights and 15-20 c/kg for heavy types.

Heavy export steers/heifers sold 10-15 c/kg dearer and topped at 364 c/kg.

Cows met solid demand, selling to a high of 299.2 c/kg, up 15 cents.

Extra restocking orders from as far north as Winton in QLD saw them sell 30 c/kg dearer for suitable steers and 15-20 for the heifer portion.

Bulls gained 15 c/kg
