After some handy falls of rain over the last few weeks, numbers were reduced to 680 head, back by 270 cattle. There was a remarkable turnaround in quality and condition of the yarding. All regular buyers were present at the rail except for a cow operator.

A better offering of prime vealers in the penning, they sold to solid demand and gained up to 10 c/kg with quality being a contributing factor.

Feeder steers met solid competition to be fully firm and reached a high of 358.2 c/kg.

Feeder heifers didn't quite reach the highs of the previous sale and sold 5-8 c/kg cheaper on average.

There was a larger penning of prime yearling steers and heifers. They sold fully firm and topped at 320 c/kg for the heifer portion and 326.2 c/kg for the steer portion.

Good numbers of heavy export weight steers and heifers saw good competition to be firm on last sale. A smaller penning of restocking cattle saw prices lift.

Cows sold to a dearer trend. Best prime D4/D5 types gained 10 c/kg, with medium and plainer cows 5 c/kg better.
