Numbers remained the same, for a yarding of 1150 cattle. Most categories were represented; however, quality and condition continue to decline week on week. Most regular buyers were present except for a Northern cow processor.

Only a few select vealers were penned, they met solid demand to be up to 10 c/kg dearer, topping at 400.2 c/kg

Yearling steers and heifers were well supplied. There were some very well-bred lines of Angus feeder steers, along with other breeds. The light end of the steers met much weaker demand and lost 20-30 cents, generally making in the 310 – 330 c/kg bracket. The heavier end of the medium weights and heavier feeder steers sold to firm rates and peaked at 376.2 c/kg. Indicating a quick changeover for the feedlotters.

Yearling heifers met better competition this sale and sold 20 – 40 cents dearer in places. Both feedlotters and processing types benefited.

Heavy export types met similar prices. The lead of the steers reached 317.2 c/kg while heifers topped out at 305.2 c/kg.

A reduced offering of cows saw a cheaper trend. Heavy D\$ & D% cows slipped 15 c/kg and sold to a high of 208.6 for 800kg Angus Cows.

Bulls saw no real price changes.

As the season deteriorates and gets colder, a bigger number of plainer cattle come into the market. Demand is weaker.
