Numbers increased this sale to 927 head, up 600 cattle. All though the larger numbers, there were limited numbers of prime vealers suitable for local butchers. All regular buyers were in attendance, however not all operated in a cheaper market.

The bulk of the yarding consisted of yearlings. Feeder steers sold considerably cheaper with restricted competition. Light and medium weights sold to a top of 510 c/kg, back by 40 cents. Heavier feeders sold to 496.6 cents, down 30-40 c/kg.

A larger offering of restocking and feeder heifers, with a single consignment of 180 heifers preg-tested empty. They met solid demand and topped at 530.2 cents, a fall of 30 c/kg.

Prime yearlings were less affected. Yearlings suitable for domestic wholesale orders slipped 10-20 c/kg. Heavy weights to supermarket orders fell 10-15 c/kg, while heavier types eased 15-20 c/kg.

Cows struggled, selling to a high of 355 c/kg, back 50 cents and more in places compared to a fortnight ago. Bulls fell 30-40 c/kg.
