Numbers remained similar for the sale a fortnight ago for a yarding of 590 cattle. It was an excellent yarding of cattle with 95% of the yarding presenting in forward to fat condition. A large percentage of the yarding were export types. A full field of buyers competed in a dearer market, quality & condition a factor.

- Prime young cattle were in greater numbers with southern processing orders competing with local buyers, pushed process 5-8c/kg dearer
- Feeder steers fully firm to reach a high of 414.2c/kg
- Not the numbers of feeder heifers this sale with most presenting with a bit of fat cover which held firm
- An excellent consignment of export steers and heifers. Younger milk and 2 tooth steers sold to 392c/kg, while the heifer portion to 375 c/kg. Older 4 & 6 teeth steers 356.6 c/kg and the heifer portion selling from 310 to 350 c/kg.
- 180 cows offered to a keen buying sector. Best heavy D4 cows topped at 311.4 c/kg & generally sold between 290-305 c/kg. Medium types to 297.2 c/kg.
- Bulls remained firm
- Any restocking types sold to 513.2 c/kg for 280kg Angus steers.
