After some very welcome rain within the drawing area on Sunday evening, numbers increased slightly for a yarding of 450 cattle, up 30 head. Overall it was a fairly good quality penning. All regular buyers were competing in a much dearer market. A regular domestic wholesaler was back in the market this week after a couple of weeks absence. They competed strongly with southern orders, pushing values 20-40c/kg up from last week. An excellent pen of euro x yearlings topped at 312.2c/kg. Yearling steers to processors sold dearer by 20c/kg. Those to feed were dearer 20-30c/kg. Yearling heifers to processors gained extra competition to sell 20-30 cents dearer. Not as many suitable heifers to feed, however those types sold to dearer trends. Export steers/heifers showed dearer trends 10-20c/kg, quality a factor. Cows gained some of the 2 previous weeks cheaper rates. Best heavy cows topped 193.2c/kg up by 20-25 cents for most. Good medium weight cows may have been 40 cents & dearer for certain lots. Bulls up to 50 cents dearer.
