Numbers increased to 800 good quality cattle, up by 120 from the sale 2 weeks ago. Once again it was a very good quality yarding with most of the cattle presenting with plenty of weight and in forward condition. A full field of buyers attended with an additional two buyers at the rail. The market was generally firm.

- Yearlings made up the biggest percentage of the penning with plenty suitable of both feedlotter and processors.
- Light weight vealers struggled to reach the highs of a fortnight ago selling firm to 6 c/kg easier.
- An exceptional offering of mostly Angus feeder steers, they sold very close to firm, maybe a couple of cents per kg short.
- Heavy steers over 500kg sold to very solid competition. Supermarket orders and exports competed. Reaching a top of 403.2 c/kg with the majority making 380-395 c/kg. Slightly cheaper 3-4 cents.
- Export cattle sold firm to 5 c/kg dearer. Bullocks sold to 403.2 c/kg. Export Heifers weighing 720 kg sold for 355 cents.
- Cows gained 5-6 cents and reached a high of 316.6 c/kg.
- Bulls to processors topped at 292 c/kg, while restockers paid up to 360.2 c/kg.
