No change in numbers this week with 180 cattle yarded. Yearlings made up the bulk of the yarding. Regular buying orders were once again active.

- Limited numbers of prime young cattle suitable for local butchers saw solid competition to reach a high of 408.2 c/kg, with most selling between 390 - 405 c/kg.
- There were some handy pens of yearling steers & heifers suitable for feedlots and restockers. They met solid demand with the steer portion selling fully firm on last weeks results, while the heifer portion selling firm to 5c/kg dearer.
- Restockong types continued to attract strong demand, selling to 465.2 c/kg
- Prime yearling steers & heifers 440 – 470kg saw reduced demand & sold 15-20 c/kg cheaper.
- Older grown 4-6 tooth heifers were firm, making from 260 – 290 c/kg.
- An extra cow order helped cows lift 8-12 c/kg, topping at 294.2 c/kg
- Best bull 255 c/kg
