Numbers increased by 140 head, for a total yarding of 600 cattle. All regular buyers were at the rail and competing. There were increased numbers of prime yearlings, suitable for the local trade, some very good heavy export steers and heifers. Less cow numbers this week and quality was not to last weeks high standard also there was extra numbers of calves. All select prime local trade cattle were fully firm, however the balance fell 5-6 c/kg. Very few feeder cattle, steers were firm, while the heifer portion sold 3-4 c/kg cheaper. Some handy heavy steer and heifers sold firm to 5 c/kg dearer. The quality of the cow offering was not to last weeks. Best heavy D4 cows topped at 255 c/kg. while good clean medium weight cows topped at 244 c/kg back about 5-10 c/kg. Quality a contributing factor. Only a handful of bulls, they fell 20c/kg. Restocking types firm.
