Quality remained good across a smaller yarding at Mudgee this week, with numbers reducing to 285 head, down from 414 head at the previous sale. Despite the lighter offering, buyer attendance remained strong, with regular processors and local competition continuing to support the market. The reduced supply, combined with improved quality, resulted in stronger competition across most categories.

Lamb quality improved noticeably this week, with a greater percentage of well-finished heavy trade and export lambs attracting spirited bidding. Crossbred lambs sold to a top of \$365/head, up from \$350/head at the previous sale, while Australian White lambs topped at \$364/head. Competition from processors was particularly strong on heavier finished lines, with the overall market showing a firm to dearer trend.

Hoggets were offered in limited numbers but remained in demand. Crossbred hoggets sold to \$280/head, while Australian White hoggets reached \$260/head. Although numbers were insufficient to establish a broad market trend, competition remained solid for quality stock. Mutton quality remained mixed, with both crossbred and Australian White ewes represented. Heavy ewes continued to attract processor interest, with Crossbred ewes selling to \$290/head, while Australian White ewes topped at \$230/head, while competition for lighter conditioned sheep was more selective.

Overall, the market recorded stronger prices across the better-finished lamb categories, underpinned by reduced yardings and solid processor demand. Quality stock continued to command excellent premiums, while plainer secondary sheep met a more selective buying panel.
