Numbers remained very low with 200 mixed quality cattle penned which is slightly down from last sale. Most of the regular buyers attended and operated in a dearer market.

Limited numbers of prime milk fed vealers met solid demand to finish 10-12 c/kg dearer.

A lack of prime conditioned yearlings saw any prime cattle sell to a much dearer trend. A pen of Euro X Yearling heifers 470 kg reached a high of 578.2 c/kg. Light weight Angus steers under 300 kg sold to a high of 644.2 c/kg. Medium weight Angus yearling steers a little of 500 kg sold to a high of 500 c/kg.

It was a small offering of export steers/heifers, they generally sold fully firm to 10 cents dearer.

There were 60 off cows offered, which considering the total numbers, it was a fair percentage of the yarding.

They saw the biggest price gains. Best heavy D4 & D5 cows topped at 416 c/kg, which was 20 cents dearer.

While good clean/medium weights reached 380 c/kg.

Bulls gained 20 c/kg.

Restockers met stronger demand and sold to 20-30 c/kg dearer.
