With rain hampering access numbers fell to 805 cattle back 200 head on last sale. It was overall a good quality penning however some cattle lacked the bloom and showed the effects of the recent cold weather. A full field of buyers attended and competed in a dearer market. Local trade butcher cattle sold 5 to 10 cents dearer with some british bred yearling heifers 20 cents dearer due to extra orders. Prime heavy weight steers & Heifers met solid competition to be up to 30 cents stronger topping @ 430 cents for 570 kg steers while the heifer portion sold to 405 cents. The majority of the yarding consisted of yearling steers & heifers and more suited to feedlotter & back grounders. Most feeder steers lifted 30 cents. Heavy types sold to 460 cents, medium weights sold to a high of 465.2 cents. Feeder heifers gained 5 to 10 cents with the majority selling between 330 & 370 cents. 170 cows met extra buying support. Best prime cows made 330 to 340 cents a lift of 15 to 20 cents medium weights saw a similar rise. Restocking & backgrounding orders were very active lifting demand & prices by 30 cents. Bulls saw a big price increase. Pens of bulls reached a high of 349.2

cents.
