Numbers remained very similar for a yarding of 435 cattle. A full field of buyers were in attendance and competed in a very solid market. Prime young cattle selling to processing orders sold to fully firm rates. A very good offering of feeder steers sold to a very keen buying demand. The majority were 440kg and better. The lighter weights sold 4-5 c/kg dearer while the heavier weights sold up to 10c/kg dearer. The heifer portion to feedlot orders sold firm to 4 c/kg dearer. The return of a supermarket order pushed suitable cattle 5c/kg dearer. Heavy steers and bullocks held firm. An excellent offerign of cows sold 10c/kg dearer. Bulls 20-30 c/kg dearer. Restockers competed strongly for suitable lines.
