Numbers increased this sale, the first for the new financial year. 545 cattle were drawn for, up by 60 head. It was an improved quality yarding. There was some exceptional supplementary fed euro cross yearlings offered, which met very good competition. A few pens of heavy prime steers. Increased numbers of well bred british bred yearlings suitable for both the feedlotter and restockers. What a difference a little bit of rain makes!! Local butchers and trade wholesalers competed strongly to secure requirements. Most were Euro cross yearlings and supplementary fed, mostly late 300 kgs to early 400 kgs. Topping at 325c/kg with a lot making between 310-322c/kg. A couple of well bred pens of Angus steers selling to a Walgett feedlotter. Sold to 323.2 c/kg weighing 446kg and returning \$1444.00. Heavy steers to sSouthern processors sold firm to 5c/kg dearer, while the heifer portion 20 c/kg better. Well bred light/medium feedlotting or restocking types sold to extra competition. The steer portion sold fully firm to 10c/kg dearer. The heifer portion sold 20-30c/kg up. Wos saw very solid demand. BEst heavy prime cows sold to 226.2c/kg up 20c/kg. The biggest
