Numbers remained steady, for a yarding of 700 cattle. All regular buyers were in attendance. It was a handy penning of cattle this week with a bigger percentage of yearling steers and heifers suitable for the feedlotter. Good numbers of cows and calves with less export types this week. Prime local trade cattle sold fully firm to 5c/kg better to processors. Feedlotter had a few more to choose from this week. They gained 6c/kg. Feeder heifers sold firm to 5c/kg dearer, however prime yearling heifers saw little change. Too few heavy export steers or heifers to quote. It was another good penning of cows. Buyers competed strongly in a dearer market. Heavy D4 cows sold to a top of 275.2 c/kg, 10c/kg dearer than last week. There were good numbers of boner cows. They gained 10-15 c/kg. Topping at 253.2 c/kg. Bulls saw little change. Calves over 120 kg sold 10-20 c/kg up.
