Numbers fell slightly for a total yarding of 950 cattle, down 200 head. All regular byers were present and active. The quality of the yarding was not as good as the previous market. Thers wasn't the lines of cattle. A lot of cross bred types were yarded. There were some very good prime local trade cattle sold, they met solid competition from butchers to be fully firm to 10 cents dearer for the best of them. The steers suitable for the feeder market were not to the previous sale standard however a couple of pens of lighter weight angus steers 340 & 360 kg sold for 408.2 cents and returned \$1465 a head (not bad for 7-8 month old calves) Medium weight feeders close to firm while heavy weights could have been 5 cents off. A regular heifer back grounding/feeder order was absent those types lost 5 to 10 cents. Very heavy prime bullocks met solid demand and sold fully firm and topped at 306.2 cents. Super market heifers milk & 2 tooth eased in price by 8 to 10 cents. Older heifers were mostly unchanged. Only quality related changes. Cows were 5 to 10 cents back however quality was not to last sale standard. Bulls similar.
