Numbers remained similar for a total yarding of 370 cattle. It was again a very mixed yarding with plain cattle offered in the majority. All regular buyers were in attendance along with the return of 2 northern processors. There was only a few pens of prime yearlings offered that were suitable for the local butchers. They met solid competition to sell from 300 to 319 cents up by 10 cents. Feeder steers sold from 255 to 291.2 cents they were to 5 cents dearer. Medium & Heavier weight feeder heifers sold from 200 to 240 cents about firm while the lighter end of the heifers struggled and sold firm to 5 cents back. It was a mostly fair to good penning of cows. Best heavy cows reached a top of 236.2 cents that was 15 cents up on last sale. Clean boner cows also sold 10 to 15 cents dearer. Very plain light conditioned cows sold to very solid demand. Selling from 50 to 141 cents. Bobby calves \$50 to \$150. Bulls also sold to a dearer trend up to 40 cents dearer
