Numbers increased this week for a yarding of 590 cattle up by 225 head. Overall it was a very good quality yarding of prime cattle with plenty of weight. There were also 80 light weight heifers suitable for restockers. All regular buyers were in attendance with a couple of extra buyers operating. Young prime local trade weight vealers & yearlings met strong competition with price rises of up to 20 cents, topping at 430.6 cents for the lead pens. Yearling steers 370 to 440 kg sold 5 to 10 cents dearer to both processors & feedlotter. Light weight heifers to backgrounders & feedlotter were unchanged. Heavier yearling heifers to the processors slipped 10 cents. The heavier yearling supermarket steers/heifers fell 10 to 15 cents. Heavy export types also eased 10 cents. A better quality offering of cows gained as much as 16 cents to a top of 309.4 cents. Bulls sold to 300 cents. Restocking cattle were mostly unchanged.
