## Conditions of Clearing Sale

1. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser.
2. The vendor shall have the right to make one or more bids, either by the auctioneer or the vendors agent.
3. The Auctioneer may, without giving any reason therefore, refuse to accept the bid of any persons and may decline the offer for any lot or withdraw any lot or lots from sale.
4. Should any dispute arise as to any bid, the relevant lot or lots may, at the option of the Auctioneer, be put up again and resold.
5. At the discretion of the Auctioneer, every bid shall be not less than the Auctioneer nominates and no person may retract his or her bid once made.
6. Each buyer shall pay in cash on the day of sale for goods purchased, and prior to delivery of the goods to the purchaser, provided that the Auctioneer may, at his discretion, extend credit for the purchase price payable to purchasers who are approved in that regard by the Auctioneer prior to the sale, and in the event of such credit being extended, interest shall be payable thereon at the rate for the time being charged by the selling agent.
7. The whole of the lots having been made available for inspection prior to the sale, no allowance or refunds will be made, nor will any buyer be permitted to reject any lot on the ground that is not correctly described in the catalogue or other information supplied.  
The said lots are to be taken with all faults (if any) and will be at the buyers risk on the fall of the hammer and thereafter the vendor and/or the Auctioneer will be free of all responsibility for safeguarding the goods and will not be liable for any loss or damage to the goods sold, whether such loss or damage is caused or contributed to by any act, neglect or default of the vendors and/or the Auctioneer, their servants, employees or agents.
8. Upon any purchaser failing to comply with any of the above conditions, all monies received in part payment shall be forfeited to the vendor and all lots uncleared may be resold by public auction or private contract, and the deficiency (if any) on such resale together with all cost and charges attending, shall be made good by the defaulting purchaser.

## SAFETY WARNING
